Introduction

2015

The Medway VCS Network was created in 2015, and gathered Leaders from across the Voluntary Sector to pool ideas, provide peer-to-peer support and channel a single voice, to speak to power about the challenges and opportunities which could be met with the inclusion of our vibrant Sector.

2018

Over subsequent years, the Network gathered for workshops and to hear inspiring speakers. By 2018, the Network was a recognised voice for Voluntary organisations of all sizes, with regular opportunities to speak to statutory officers and Leaders on a range of issues affecting Medway and our Sector.

2020

During the pandemic of 2020, the VCS Leaders Network took a back seat to the emergent community update meetings, which saw organisations band together in a time of crisis and display an impressive amount of unrestricted collaboration to support each other through the most difficult of times.

2025

In the background of this regular meeting, key Leaders from within the VCS Leaders Network bid to launch two streams of work to further enhance, validate and empower the VCS Sector in Medway, including the Transformation Academy and the Alliance.

Both of these workstreams have run for a three-year funded period and are now preparing to fold back into the VCS Leaders Network from whence they came, in order to bolster the VCS Leaders Network offer, and set foundations for a re-born Network – fit for the challenges of the future.

A reborn Network

Key to the success of the Network moving forward is sustainability.

The value and impact is undisputed.

In a world where nothing is certain, and funding is more restricted than ever, the Network needs to re-establish itself in a more sustainable way, to ensure its future – its future value to its members and its future impact with and for the Sector as a whole.

Members of the VCS Steering Group have met to re-design the VCS Network offer and will re-launch this at a forthcoming spring 2025 event.

The Steering Group recognise that the Network holds value in different ways for different organisations, according to size, resource and the topic of the day, and so has structured the membership entry points accordingly, which incorporate a range of services accessible to VCS Leaders*.

*Leaders is a collective term for eligible members, and includes people who hold the role CEO, COO, Executive Director, Manager or Trustee. The defining criteria is that members should be the Leaders of their respective organisation and be in decision making positions at the head of their organisations.



Membership defined

Sponsored	1 year sponsored fee	Smaller and micro charities can access the VCS Leaders Network at zero or subsidised costs by partnering with a larger charity who would like to sponsor another organisation. A list of potential sponsors is available on request.

Membership is charged annually by invoice from MVA, who hold and administrate the VCS Leaders' account and provide the permanent secretariat to the VCS Leaders Network and Steering Group.
